# A Message from ORT America

---

Dear Friends,

**Looking back at 2022, we are so grateful to have returned to more normal operations as Covid-related concerns receded, allowing us to be together to mark our milestone 100th Anniversary. At the same time, while we were anticipating our many local and national celebrations, the unexpected happened with the outbreak of war in Ukraine, right at the start of the new year.**

We were amazed at how our community came together – in many cases in person – for our centennial events, while also opening their hearts – and wallets – to respond to the emergency needs of our Ukraine students, teachers, and families.

ORT has a history of success in bringing people together in both good and challenging situations and 2022 was no exception. The generosity of supporters and friends across the country meant that we could continue to fund the many worthy endeavors that need our help, including:

- \$1.9 million raised for our Ukraine emergency campaign. These funds supported essential needs such as food and water, medicines, shelter, transportation, heat and electricity, and so much more.
- A magnificent national Gala to celebrate 100 years and honor Dr. Conrad Giles. The event together with 100th anniversary activities raised more than \$600,000.
- In-person travel experiences including missions to Israel and New Orleans, and the International Cooperation Symposium to Bulgaria and Greece, that brought participants face-to-face with our beneficiaries and inspired us to continue our important work.
- Ongoing investment in our Israel-based initiatives in Kiryat Yam, Kfar Silver and other communities serving nearly 10,000 students in the periphery.

## National and International Highlights

**This was a year of triumphs and tragedy. We celebrated the 75th anniversary of the State of Israel in May and mourned with the people of Israel on the October 7th attacks. See below some highlights from this eventful year.**

### ORT Leaders Gathered for the General Assembly in Israel/75th Anniversary May 2023

ORT leaders traveled to Israel for the JFNA General Assembly that coincided with Israel's 75th Anniversary. Drs. Lynda and Conrad Giles, World ORT President, Dan Green, World ORT Director General and CEO and Barbara Birch, ORT America President and CEO, stood shoulder to shoulder with thousands of attendees at Tel Aviv's Expo Center to hear from President Isaac Herzog among others. They also took part in programs and site visits, and a moving Yom HaZikaron service with 7,000 in attendance at Latrun, the military memorial site.

The tour wrapped in Michigan where Amos spoke at Ann Arbor Chapter's donor recognition event. In Detroit, Amos attended a lunch with the ORT Michigan Board.

### Unity Mission to Israel October 18-19, 2023



Barbara Birch, President and CEO of ORT America, traveled with 50 U.S. Jewish community leaders to Israel to present a

united front of support. Organized by the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, the group met with government figures and victims of the October 7 attacks.

ORT America partnered with the Jewish Federations of North America and 50 other organizations in a global “Blue Ribbons for Israel” campaign, asking people to show their support for the hostages being held in Gaza on their shirts and display them on their social media platforms.

### **Annual Meeting October 22, 2023**

ORT America held its Annual Meeting via Zoom, where Amos Gofer, CEO, Kfar Silver Youth Village, joined live from Israel to share updates on the current situation and what ORT is doing to help students and teachers cope after the events of October 7th. Dan Green, World ORT Director General and CEO also spoke about ongoing ORT initiatives in Israel and Ukraine.

The meeting addressed ORT’s student work in the Digital Skills Academy Summer Program in Sofia, Bulgaria, and the Young

Entrepreneurship Program winning team from Brazil. In addition, there were tributes to Howard Lanznar, the outgoing Chairman of the Board, and Jeff Cooper, who retired as CFO after 10 years at ORT America. We also welcomed Michael Perlmutter, the new Chairman of the Board and Louanne Smolin, who will Chair of the Executive Committee.

### **Mission to Mexico City November 2-6, 2023**



Thirty ORT supporters attended ORT America’s Mission to Mexico City. Over four days participants had opportunities to learn about the city’s rich history and culture and to meet members of the Jewish community. The highlight of the trip was a visit to

Colegio Olamí ORT – a shining example of the educational opportunities ORT makes available to its students.

It was a meaningful opportunity for our ORT community to be together and celebrate our global Jewish family.

### **FedPro2023 November 5-7, 2023**



ORT America was a proud sponsor at FedPro2023 in Chicago. ORT professionals Jim Lodge, Senior Development Officer, and Heath Blumstein, Director, Southwest Region, attended the event with over 1,000 Jewish Federation professionals from across the United States and Canada. The ORT booth was a popular destination to learn more about ORT and its response to the Israel crisis.

Michigan's ORT in the City event generated nearly \$170,000 in support of ORT's educational programs.

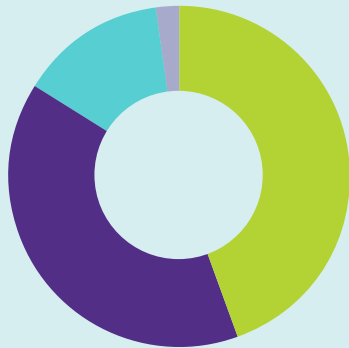

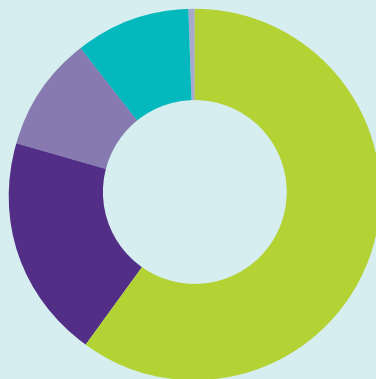
